The Finnish Jalkavaenkivaari m/28 was issued in 1928. Differences between the m/28 and the typical 1891 Russian Mosin-Nagant are:

- Shorter And Heavier Barrel
- Improved Trigger
- Single Piece Extractor/Spring
- Shorter Stock
- Improved Rear And Front Sights
- Forward and Rear Hand Guard Bands Are Held In Place by Screws and Not Springs
- M/28 Bayonet is Similar to a Typical Mauser Bayonet in Appearance
- Bore Diameter is Typically in the .308 Range.

The m/28 came into its fame when Finnish Sniper Simo Hahya was credited with over 500 Soviet soldier kills during the Winter War, while carrying a sniper version of the m/28.
